The Mission of Peter to the Gentiles

Peter in Lydda (Acts 9: 32-35)

- 1. Peter visited the Christian brethren in Lydda.
- 2. He met a man that was paralyzed for 8years, named Aeneas.
- 3. Peter healed him in the name of Jesus
- 4. The news of his healing spread all over Lydda and Sharon.

Peter in Joppa (Acts 9: 36-43)

- 1. When Peter left Lydda he went to Joppa and there was a woman in Joppa named Tabitha also called Dorcas.
- 2. She was devoted, kind and generous. She died before Peter got to Joppa
- 3. The widows in Joppa showed the dress that the Tabitha sewed for them.
- 4. Peter met her dead body on the bed and told everybody to move out.
- 5. Peter prayed to God and she was raised from dead.
- 6. The news spread over Joppa and they pleaded with Peter to stay with them for some days and he stayed in the house of Simon the Tanner.

Significance:

- 1. Peter's Pastoral visits, shows how Church leaders must pay regular visits to branches under them.
- 2. Church leaders must seek the welfare of their flock.

The Conversion of Cornelius (Acts 10: 1 - 48)

- 1. Cornelius was a Gentiles and a Roman army officer.
- 2. He was God fearing prayerful and devoted.
- 3. He was full of alms giving.
- 4. He saw a vision of an angel of God that told him to send for Peter at Joppa.

- 5. He sent three of his men to Peter at Joppa.
- 6. Peter also had a trance after fasting at the top of the roof
- 7. Peter saw a great sheet that dropped from heaven.
- 8. In it were different Kinds of animals and God told him to take all the animals and eat
- 9. Peter refused and said that he had never eaten anything unclean before.
- 10. God told him not to call what he had made cleaned unclean.
- 11. The instruction came three times but Peter refused to eat
- 12. He was thinking of the interpretation of the trance when the men sent by Cornelius came.
- 13. Cornelius had gathered together all his household before Peter arrive
- 14. As soon as Cornelius saw Peter coming, he fell down at his feet and worshipped him.
- 15. Peter forbade him from doing so that he was a man like him.
- 16. Peter came in and preached the gospel of Jesus and Cornelius and his household got converted and received the Holy Spirit.

Significance:

- It shows that it requires divine intervention to break Jewish discrimination against the Gentiles
- 2. God is ready to break the barrier of discrimination against the growth of the Church.
- It shows that there is no discrimination with God and all men are equal in His sight.
