Setting

Faceless is set in Accra, Ghana. In post independence Africa, some colonial GRAs still exist for the rich and successful individuals in the society like in Accra. The majority, poor people residential area is unorganized and planless houses called slum. The events in the novel shift between the places inhabited by these two subgroups. Agbogbloshie market iis an important location in the novel.

In temporal context, the story is set in the period between 1980s and the 21<sup>st</sup> century. The novel is also set within the subculture of prostitution in a typical modern African city; a culture characterised by organised criminality, threat, fear and intimidation.
