Topic Abstinence

Content

Abstinence is a self-enforced restraint from indulging in bodily activities that are widely accepted and experienced as giving pleasure. Most frequently, the term is known as sexual abstinence. This practice can arise from religious prohibition and practical considerations. Abstinence may also refer to restraint from drugs. For example one can abstain from smoking.

Sexual abstinence is a choice to not participate in any genital contact. The choice is usually made for a specific moral, religious, legal or health reason. It is the act of not having sex. The personal definition of this can range from no sexual contact to anything but intercourse.

For our purpose, abstinence is defined as no genital or anal contact between people. This involves restraining from all forms of sexual intercourse and contact, ensuring that there is no exchange of body fluids such as vagina secretions or semen.

Abstinence is the best prevention from STDs, and the only guarantee against them, only if there is no genital or anal contact or sharing semen or vaginal fluids.

Abstinence prevents unwanted pregnancy as long as no semen enters the vagina. There is no hormonal or medical side effect . in terms of birth control, abstinence means not allowing sperm near the woman's body.
