### **Holiness of God**

# Isaiah's Vision of the Holiness of God (Isa 6: 1-7)

- 1. In the year that King Josiah died, Isaiah had a vision of the holiness of God in the temple.
- 2. He saw the Lord sitting upon the throne highly lifted up, His train filled the temple.
- 3. There were many Seraphim who stood upon the throne each of them has six wings, two to cover his face, two to cover his feet and two to fly.
- 4. The Seraphim were shouting: "Holy, holy is the Lord of host, the whole earth is full of his glory"
- 5. The foundation of God's throne shook and smoke filled everywhere.
- 6. Facing with God's holiness, Isaiah became conscious of his sin as well as that of Israel; he felt lost and confessed his uncleanliness.
- 7. A Seraphim flew to where Isaiah was and torched his lips with burning coal from the altar.
- 8. The burning coal cleansed his lips and was made holy before God.

### Significance:

God's holiness consists in His being set apart from all that was unholy or immoral and no such thing can survive in His presence

## Isaiah's Teaching on the Holiness of God (Isaiah 1: 10-20)

- 1. After Isaiah's vision and the touching of his mouth with burning coal from above, he started his teaching to the people of Israel.
- 2. Isaiah said that he knew, the people believe in God but their hearts were far away from God.
- 3. They had separated religion from morality and thought they could serve God by offering sacrifice only.
- 4. He said their leaders too were very corrupt.
- 5. God was always pleased with their sacrifices when there was regular worship

- and sacrifice.
- 6. Isaiah condemned their shallow religiosity.
- 7. He said God would no longer tolerate immorality, false religion and vain worship because of their wickedness and immorality.
- 8. God would no longer listen to their prayers when they call upon Him.
- 9. Isaiah made a call to national repentance and holiness of life.
- 10. He called them to repent by cleansing themselves from their sin.
- 11. He said whatever how their sins might be so big; God is ready to make them white as snow.
- 12. God promised them that they would reap the good of the land, if they repented, but if they refused to repent then, they shall be devoured by sword.

#### SIGNIFICANCE OF ISAIAH'S TEACHING ON THE HOLINESS OF GOD

- 1. The religious situation in the time of Isaiah is similar to ours today.
- 2. We have separated religion from morality and preach only materialism and prosperity
- 3. We must repent and give our lives to Jesus
- 4. We must learn to combine worship with righteousness living.
