STITCHES
The knowledge of correct ways to make stitchesfrom the foundation to development of skill in needle work.
TYPES OF STITCHES
1. TEMPORARY STITCHES: These stitches as the name suggests, are removed as soon as they have served their purposes. They are;
a. Even tacking.
b. Uneven tacking.
c. Diagonal tacking.
d. Tailor's tacking.
2. PERMANENT STITCHES : These are used directly, to sew two or more pieces of materials together. At times, those stitches may be decorative. These include;
a. Running stitches.
b. Back stitch.
c. Hemming stitch.
d. Button holes stitch.
e. Oversewing stitch.
3. DECORATIVE STITCHES : Decorative or embroidery stitches are used to beautify an article, whether a garment or household goods. Some are ;
