Topic: Meaning, causes and effects of STI /HIV/AIDS..

Sexually transmitted infections (STI) are infections that can be caught or passed on when you have unprotected sex or close sexual contact with another person.

Sexually transmitted diseases (STD) are mostly passed on through the close intimate contact that usually accompanies sexual activities. Some common sexually transmitted diseases includes;

- a) Human immunodeficiency virus (HIV)
- b) Gonorrhoea
- c) Chlamydia
- d) Syphillis
- e) Hepatitis etc

HIV /AIDS: human immunodeficiency virus is a sexually transmitted disease or virus that breaks down certain CD4+CELLS in your immune system which makes it easier to get really sick and die from infections that your body could normally fight off.

It is a virus that causes AIDS(Acquired immune deficiency syndrome.

Causes of HIV/AIDS:

- a) By sharing needles or syringes with infected persons.
- b) By having unprotected sex or sexual intercourse.
- c) By getting stuck with a needle that has infected blood on it.
- d) By mother to child blood transfusion during pregnancy or breastfeeding.

Effects of HIV /AIDS:

- a) Death
- b) Stigmatisation
- c) Financial burden (poverty)
- d) Loss of employees
- e) Orphans etc.

Preventive measures includes

- a) Blood should be properly screened before it is transfused into patients.
- b) It is important to live a responsible sexual life among couples and unmarried partners.
- c) Do not share needles or sharp objects with people to avoid being infected.
- d) Pregnant women should be tested for HIV regularly.
